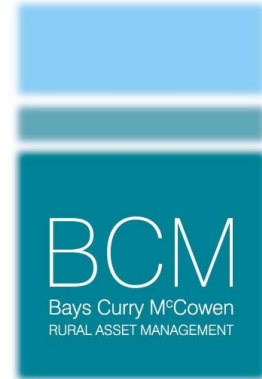


# Press release
